Engaging with Your Child

Each of us, from adults to children alike, need to know that

we are loved and that we are special to someone. When this love isn't present in our lives it can affect us greatly. As adults we cope with the lack of love very differently from children. Research has shown that if a baby or very young child is neglected to be loved it can actually alter that child's brain development.



Showing that you love your child can be very varied as we all express love and receive love differently. Of course, there's the "I love you" (which we all should hear spoken to us at least once a day!) but there are also more subtle but just as meaningful ways we can communicate love to our child. "Being present" is a great one. That simply means giving your child undivided attention for a few moments at least

Taking interest in their day is another way. I have two boys so if I would ask them after school "what did you do today?" I'd get the usual "I dunno" or "lots of things" so I quickly learnt to ask them to tell me 3 things they enjoyed that day and 1 thing they didn't like. That gave us much more to talk about and helped my boys to express their feelings about their day in a safe space. It also showed them that I cared about them and what they were doing.

Of course, there's also the power of positive touch. By that I

mean, the hug, the kiss on the cheek, the pat on the back the stroke of the hair, all these communicate that you love them, that you care about them, that they are special.

Knowing that they're loved, valued and important to you will help your child to not only become a well 'rounded' person but it will also help them to perform better at school.
